Operational observations welcomed from bus operators. Query from Sustrans (MD) on whether delays for pedestrians are being considered as part of the work.</li> </ul>	operator s
5.	<ul> <li>BPF Strategic Bus Network Plan and Workstream C:         <ul> <li>As noted previously, GCC have already published the bus network gap map in Glasgow Transport Strategy Spatial Delivery Framework in January and February 2024. GCC reporting on Strategic Bus Network Plan work overall to committee in April 2024.</li> <li>Other local authorities present noted the work is useful but there are concerns over delivery given lack of funding for bus infrastructure.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

#### 6. **SPT Update:**

- SPT offered update on the Strathclyde Regional Bus Strategy (SRBS) work and noted publication of recommendations from first stage of the work, with consultation on this due to commence in April 2024 for 6 weeks. Appraisal report will also be published. On track to complete SRBS by June 2025. SPT noted all are working together to secure more investment in bus in the region, and a strong private sector is also needed for franchising. Chair (JA) expressed surprise at use of "long term" under recommendation 4 against the need for a 'bus friendly' roads network. DC also noted an expectation that investment in bus priority infrastructure would have had a more prominent position in the recommendations.
- SPT Budget approved at SPT Partnership Board on 15th March, and still in dialogue with Transport Scotland.
- Zonecard updates coming on-stream in summer. Query from operators as to why this has been delayed.

#### 7. **GCC Update**

- Bus Co-ordination Group this group will now meet monthly instead of quarterly based on feedback from group members. Planning to submit a paper to AMOC to raise awareness of impact works have on buses. April mtg will include an update on forthcoming works by GCC (& linked to Transport Scotland works) around Charing Cross.
- Public facing bus enforcement campaign "Don't be a bus blocker" underway since February 2024 and gaining positive feedback and Bus interactions on social media. Bus operators suggested they could aim to operator gather any feedback from bus drivers on noticeable improvements around s issues being tackled by the campaign. GCC (CF) confirmed the bus coordination sub-group is also discussing the topic of lining and signing needing upgraded to support enforcement against irresponsible parking in bus stops and bus lanes.

GCC continuing to develop a proposal for Workplace Parking Licencing GCC as per Council adopted policy. Workplace / business engagement will be (CP) commencing in 2024 and will include bus operators.

#### 8. **Updates from other Councils**

## **East Dunbartonshire Council:**

- Signalization project at Canniesburn Toll ongoing. Road open, but still working under temporary traffic lights until completion. The original completion is spring 2024 is likely to slip, but I have not been advised of the new date yet. Continue to liaise and update SPT and operators.
- A803 Corridor Improvements Project part of City Deal public consultation commenced in March with 3 shortlisted options. The drop-in event last week was very well attended. SPT and GCC involved in the project and consultation
- A807 Consultation is also ongoing and includes proposed speed limit change and proposed changes to bus stop locations. SPT have responded to the consultation, and the only operator on the A807 in McColls who have also been asked for a view.

## **South Lanarkshire Council:**

- A further 40 junctions being equipped with bus priority signal capability.
- Final stage of Local Transport Strategy consultation in summer 2024/
