Email Signature and Out of Office

It is important that all staff use the approved email signature on all new emails and replies. This protects the corporate identify of Glasgow City Council and ensures your colleagues have your up to date contact details. Your signature should be in font Arial, black text and the size at least 10pt. Your email signature should be at least the size of your email text.

If you are unable to respond to emails for a period of time, it is important that the Out of Office tool is utilised on Outlook. All colleagues must include information about who to contact if the request requires urgent attention and include the following text regarding how to forward a Freedom of Information Request:

The event featured insightful sessions, including a welcome address by George Gillespie, Executive Director and Councillor Ruairi Kelly, Convener for Built Heritage and Development, a presentation on working together by Jenny O'Hagan, Director of Service Delivery, and a discussion on developing a shared vision for the Planning Service led by Ben Wilson, Divisional Director for Development and Regeneration. Based at the Hunter Street Health and Care Centre, Glasgow's Safer Drug Consumption Facility is called 'The Thistle' and opened on Monday 13 January 2025. Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership (HSCP) is working with NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (NHSGGC) and other partners to develop a pilot Safer Drug Consumption Facility (SDCF). It is the first Safer Drug Consumption Facility in Scotland and the United Kingdom.

Everyone is welcome to visit The Thistle. We are organising visits which will include a short tour of the service, and you can also learn about what we offer and our goals. You will have the chance to ask any questions you may have about the service. See below for available dates for visiting.

Welcoming Kevin Argue to His New Role

We caught up with Kevin Argue, the newly appointed Head of Service for Sustainable Transport, Traffic and Road Safety, to find out about himself and his new role:

Tell us a bit about your Career Background?

I worked for East Dunbartonshire Council for 12 years where I had worked in planning roles in before ultimately moving into transport infrastructure and public realm delivery roles, before then progressing to the role of Team Leader for Regeneration and Town Centres.

I then moved over Stirling Council for 4 years, where I was the Team Leader for Transport Development covering transport strategy, infrastructure projects, roads development control, parking and access management.

Following that, I moved to Glasgow City Council in August 2021 where I took on the role of Group Manager for Sustainable Transport in NRS, where I was able to support the Team to deliver a variety of active and sustainable transport infrastructure projects and initiatives, before progressing to my new role of Head of Service Sustainable Transport, Traffic and Parking Operations.

What is your role within NRS?

I am the Head of Service for Sustainable Transport, which includes the design and delivery of a wide range active and sustainable transport infrastructure projects and behaviour change initiatives as well the Council's Transport Strategy and Liveable Neighbourhood teams. Additionally, my new extends to Traffic Network and Road Safety teams as well Parking Operations, whom I worked closely with in my pervious role. The synergy across the service grouping will enable us to undertake holistic place based approach to service delivery.

What makes you proud to have a leadership position within the service?

I thrive on working with teams and people to deliver high quality outcomes for our communities. By providing people the platform to succeed, we can deliver together.

What challenges are you most excited to tackle within your?

This role provides a unique opportunity to reduce silos and improve our ability to deliver high quality outcomes for our communities and for those visiting our wonderful city. I am excited to continue to work across the organisation and achieve together.
