### **SCREENING DETERMINATION FOR GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL'S FINAL DRAFT NORTH GLASGOW STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK**

This letter sets out the Council's determination under Section 8(1) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 on whether or not a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is required for the Council's final draft North Glasgow Strategic Development Framework (SDF).

#### **SEA Screening Process**

The screening process involved consulting the following Consultation Authorities on whether the final draft North Glasgow SDF is likely to have significant environmental effects:

- Historic Environment Scotland
- NatureScot
- Scottish Environment Protection Agency

In addition to consulting with the above bodies, the Council has also taken into account the criteria set out in Schedule 2 of the 2005 Act in determining whether or not the final draft North Glasgow SDF is likely to have significant environmental effects.

The Council wrote to the Consultation Authorities on the 26<sup>th</sup> of October 2022. The responses are summarised as follows:

NatureScot	<p>We understand that the North Glasgow SDF provides detailed information that supports the policies and proposals of the City Development Plan, which has been subject to the SEA process. We welcome the detail provided on previous SEA work carried out for the City Development Plan, and how this relates to the North Glasgow SDF. We note that the SDF does not introduce any new policies, nor does it support any potential future development proposals that would be contrary to the policies of the adopted City Development Plan. On this basis, we agree with the Council's conclusion that the SDF is not likely to have any significant environmental effects.</p>	NONE
Scottish Environment Protection Agency	<p>In regard to our main areas of interest (air, water, soil, human health, material assets and climatic factors) we agree with the conclusions of the screening report that the proposed PPS is unlikely to have significant environmental effects.</p> <p>It is our understanding that the SDF implements Policy CDP2 of the current adopted Glasgow City Development Plan which has been subject to a full SEA. It is noted that the SDF puts forward a series of principles none of which establish any new policies or support potential future development proposals which would be contrary to the policies of the adopted development plan.</p>	NONE
