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**Glasgow City and Neighbourhoods
Population Changes in 2011-2016**

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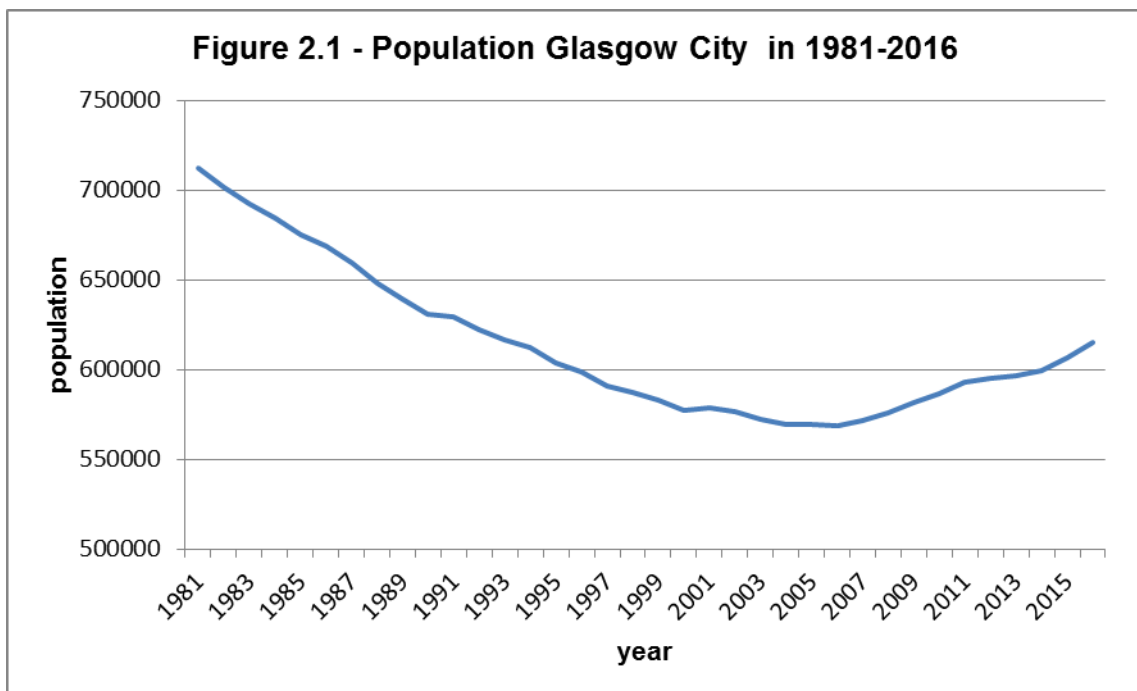
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1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Glasgow City Council – Development and Regeneration Services published, on 30th September 2016, a briefing paper on demographic changes **in 2011-2015** for Glasgow City and Neighbourhoods. It presented the results of an analysis of population estimates from National Records of Scotland (NRS) since 2011, when the latest population census was held.
- 1.2 2016 population estimates for Council and Health Board areas (published by NRS on 27th April 2017) and estimates for small areas (data zones, published on 24th August 2017) allow this analysis to be updated.
- 1.3 Total population change and components of change **for 2011-2016** are examined in section 2 of this paper. Section 3 gives a description of population change by age. Population change by neighbourhood in Glasgow is the topic of section 4. The Appendix gives Tables with more detailed information.
- 1.4 In the main text figures have been rounded to the nearest 100.

2. TOTAL POPULATION CHANGE

- 2.1 The 2016 mid-year estimate of Glasgow's population is 615,100. Figure 2.1 shows that the population has been growing since 2006. Before 2006 there was a sizable decline in Glasgow's population. However, the rate of decline was reducing steadily: from 8,300 per year in 1981-1991 to 5,100 per year in 1991-2001 and 2,000 per year in 2001-2006. The population rose by 4,900 per year in 2006-2011. After 2011, the population growth continued, but at a slightly lower rate: by 4,400 per year in 2011-2016 (see Appendix, Table A1).



- 2.2 The switch from population decline in 2001-2006 to population growth in 2006-2011 is due to (1) an improved natural change position (the difference between births and deaths): from -800 per year in 2001-2006 to +600 per year in 2006-2011; and (2) an improved migration position: from a net loss of 2,700 per year in 2001-2006 to a net gain of 3,500 per year in 2006-2011 (See Table 2.1 and Appendix, Tables A2 and A3).
- 2.3 Population growth due to natural change increased from 600 per year in 2006-2011 to 1,000 per year in 2011-2016 (see Appendix, Table A2). Table 2.1 shows that annual migration is approximately the same in the two periods 2006-2011 and 2011-2016 (3,500 per year). The higher rate of growth of Glasgow's population **before** 2011 is due to "other changes" in those years (see Appendix, Table A3). These "other changes" mainly represent an adjustment to reconcile migration estimates with the 2011 Census population estimates.

- 2.4 Table 2.1 splits Glasgow's net migration position by type. A sizable net gain from "Overseas – other" migration (4,500 per year) and a reduction in net losses to other Glasgow and Clyde Valley Council areas (from -4,100 per year in 2001-2006 to -2,600 in 2006-2011) resulted in a strongly positive net migration position (3,500 per year) for Glasgow City in 2006-2011.
- 2.5 It is of interest to note Glasgow's improving net migration position in relation to "Rest of Scotland" (this excludes the Glasgow Conurbation as defined by the Glasgow and the Clyde Valley area) and "Rest of United Kingdom". This change may indicate that Glasgow is considered, within the UK, as a more attractive place to live, which could be an impact from events like the Commonwealth Games in 2014.
- 2.6 Since 2011, the annual net migration gain from "Overseas – other" migration has reduced somewhat (from 4,500 per year in 2006-2011 to 3,400 in 2011-2016) and the net flow of asylum seekers into Glasgow has increased (see Table 2.1 and Appendix, Table A3). Net migration from "Overseas – other" has been the main component of Glasgow's net migration gain in the last decade.
- 2.7 Since 2011, Glasgow's net migration losses to the rest of the Conurbation have increased: from -2,600 per year in 2006-2011 to -3,400 per year in 2011-2016 (see Table 2.1). This is likely to be related to a partial upturn in the housing market, resulting in more people buying a house elsewhere in the Conurbation.

- 2.8 Table 2.2 splits Glasgow's net migration position with the rest of the Conurbation by Council area. Since 2011 there have been higher migration losses from Glasgow City to the suburban areas East Dunbartonshire (from -400 per year in 2006-2011 to -700 per year in 2011-2016) and East Renfrewshire (from -600 per year in 2006-2011 to -900 per year in 2011-2016).

- 2.9 Table 2.3 shows Glasgow's net migration by age. In the period 2001-2006 there was a **net inflow** for the age group "15 to 24" (+3,400 per year) with **net outflows** for the age groups "0 to 14" (-1,500 per year), "25 to 44" (-3,100 per year) and "45 and over" (-1,500 per year). The position changed considerably in 2006-2011, with **net inflows** for the age groups "15 to 24" (+4,600 per year) and "25 to 44" (+100 per year) and considerably reduced **net outflows** for the age groups "0 to 14" (-600 per year) and "45 and over" (-600 per year).
- 2.10 Since 2011 Glasgow's migration position has changed again with a resumption of a net outflow for the age group "25 to 44" (-400 per year) and a higher net outflow for the age group "0 to 14" (-900 per year). This indicates that, relative to the period 2006-2011, more families have left the City in the recent period (2011-2016).

3. POPULATION BY AGE

3.1 Table 3.1 gives the estimated change for Glasgow's population between 2011 and 2016.

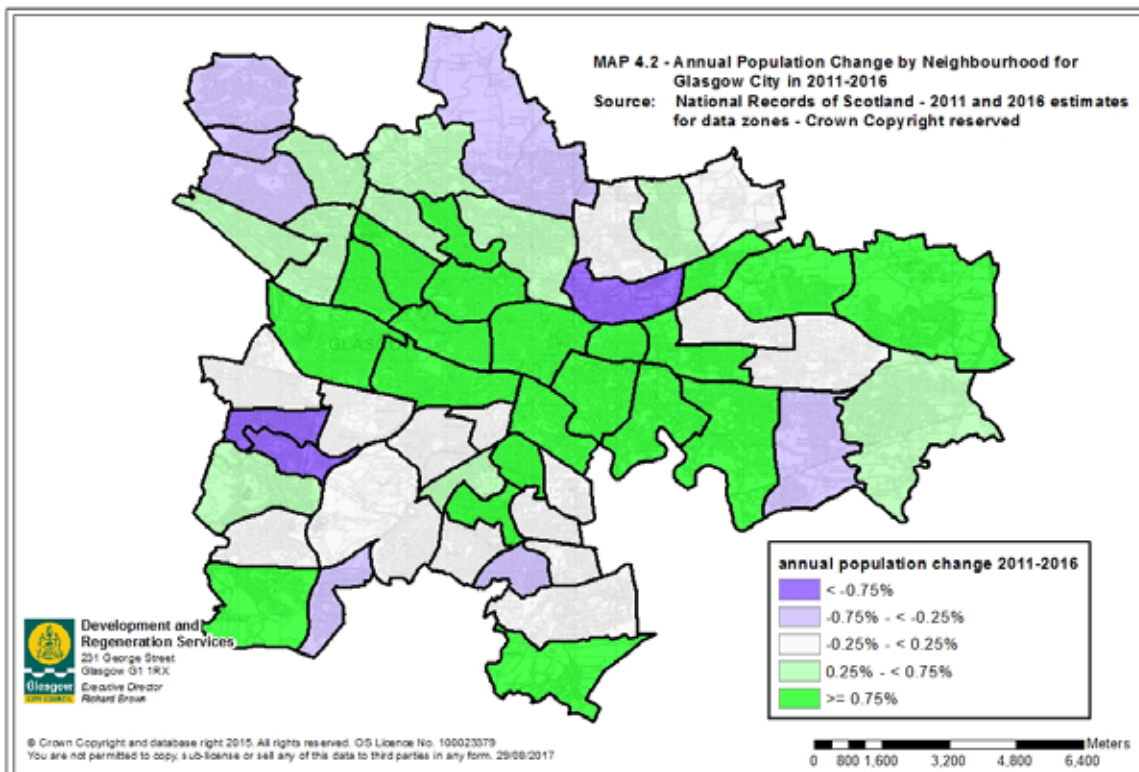
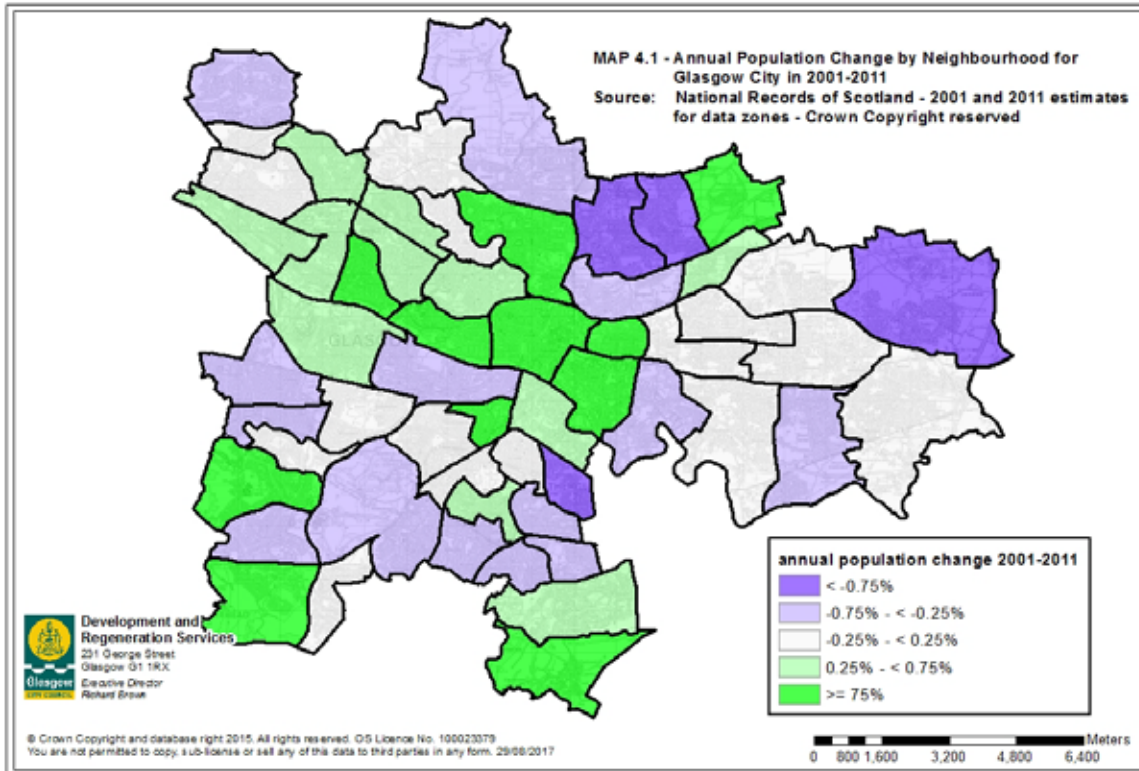
3.2 In a comparison of population change by age, it is important to realise that population changes are largely driven by the sizes of the various age cohorts. A **reduction** for an age group does not therefore necessarily imply a net **outflow**. Similarly, an **increase** for an age group is not always the result of a net **inflow**.

3.3 An example is the age group "16 to 24". Table 3.1 shows a reduction of -5,300 for that age group in 2011 to 2016. The reason is that, in 2011, the age group "16 to 24" is considerably larger than the age-group "11 to 19" (i.e. the cohort that will be aged "16 to 24" in 2016). This reduction of -5,300 takes place despite a **net inflow** of 5,200 per year for the age group "15 to 24" in 2011-2016 (see Table 2.3).

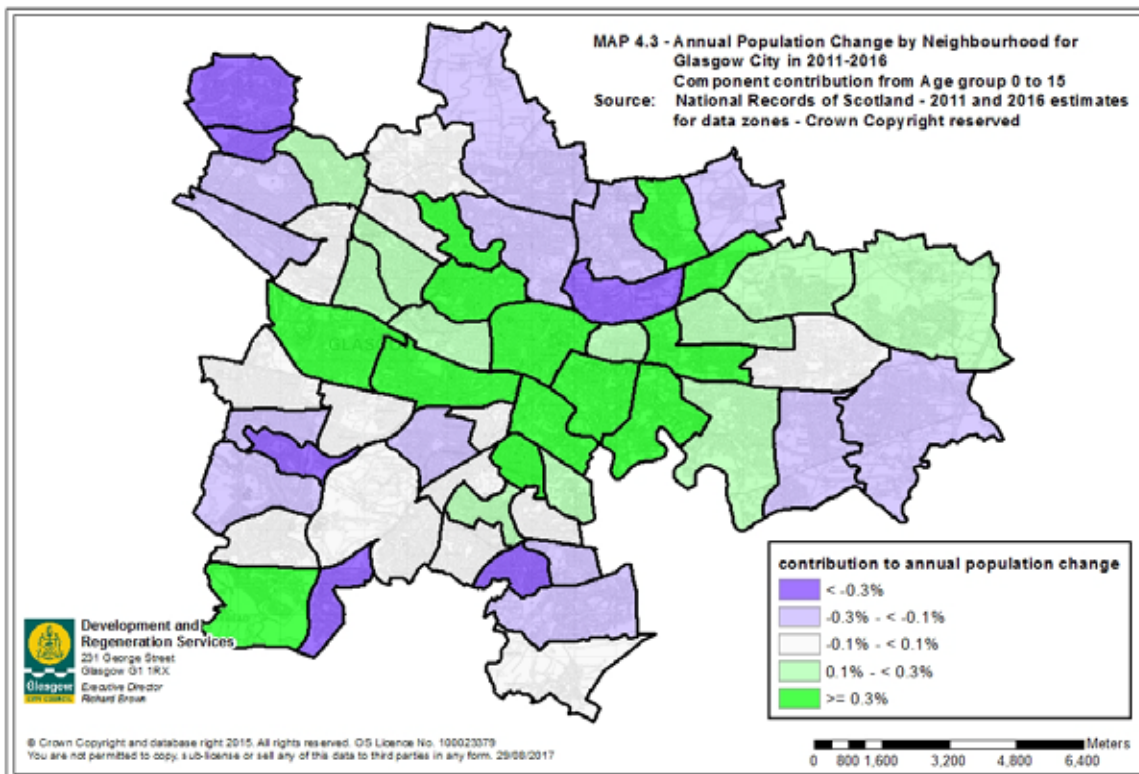
3.4 The estimated population for Glasgow in 2016 (at 615,100) exceeds by 11,200 the projected population for 2016 (at 603,900) in the most recent NRS projections (2014-base). This is due to a considerably larger net migration inflow (6,900 per year, compared with a projected figure of 1,500 per year).

4. POPULATION CHANGE BY NEIGHBOURHOOD

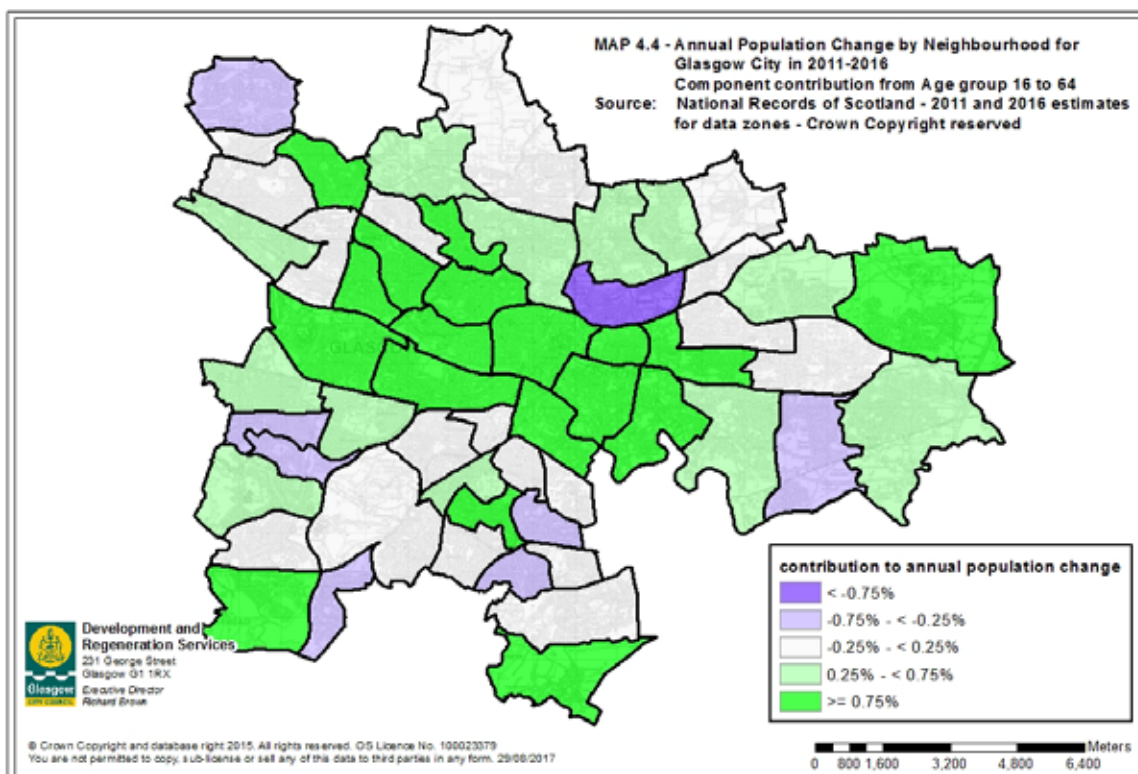
- 4.1 National Records of Scotland (NRS) have now published the 2016 Small Area Population Estimates (SAPE). That makes it possible to examine changes in 2011-2016 for the 56 neighbourhoods in Glasgow.
- 4.2 The 56 neighbourhoods, used in this chapter, were defined several years ago by DRS staff for the purposes of reporting to Local Housing Forums. At that time there were ten Local Housing Forums, with each Forum dealing with one of the City's ten Community Planning Partnership (CPP) areas. The CPP areas were considered too large to be meaningful when discussing local priorities for housing investment and regeneration. In consultation with Housing Associations, the CPP areas were sub-divided into areas, which people living in those areas would recognize as their neighbourhood (see Appendix for a map of the City's Neighbourhoods).
- 4.3 Maps 4.1 and 4.2 (see page 7) give the annual population changes by neighbourhood in, respectively, 2001-2011 and 2011-2016 (see also Appendix, Table A5).
- 4.4 In 2001-2011 there was a corridor of population growth in the City Centre north of the river Clyde (from Broomhill/Partick West to Calton/Bridgeton and Dennistoun). In 2011-2016 that corridor has expanded into the North West (Hillhead, Maryhill Road Corridor and Hyndland/Dowanhill/Partick East), into the East (Haghill/Carntyne, Parkhead/Dalmarnock and Tollcross/West Shettleston) and into the South (Greater Govan, Ibrox/Kingston, Greater Gorbals, Govanhill and Langside/Battlefield).
- 4.5 In the recent period, 2011 to 2016, there has also been population growth in the North East of the City: from Blackhill/Hogganfield to Ruchazie/Garthamlock and Easterhouse.
- 4.6 Areas with the highest rate of population loss are Sighthill/Royston, Crookston/South Cardonald and Corkerhill/North Pollok. In many cases population losses are related to housing demolitions in the areas concerned.



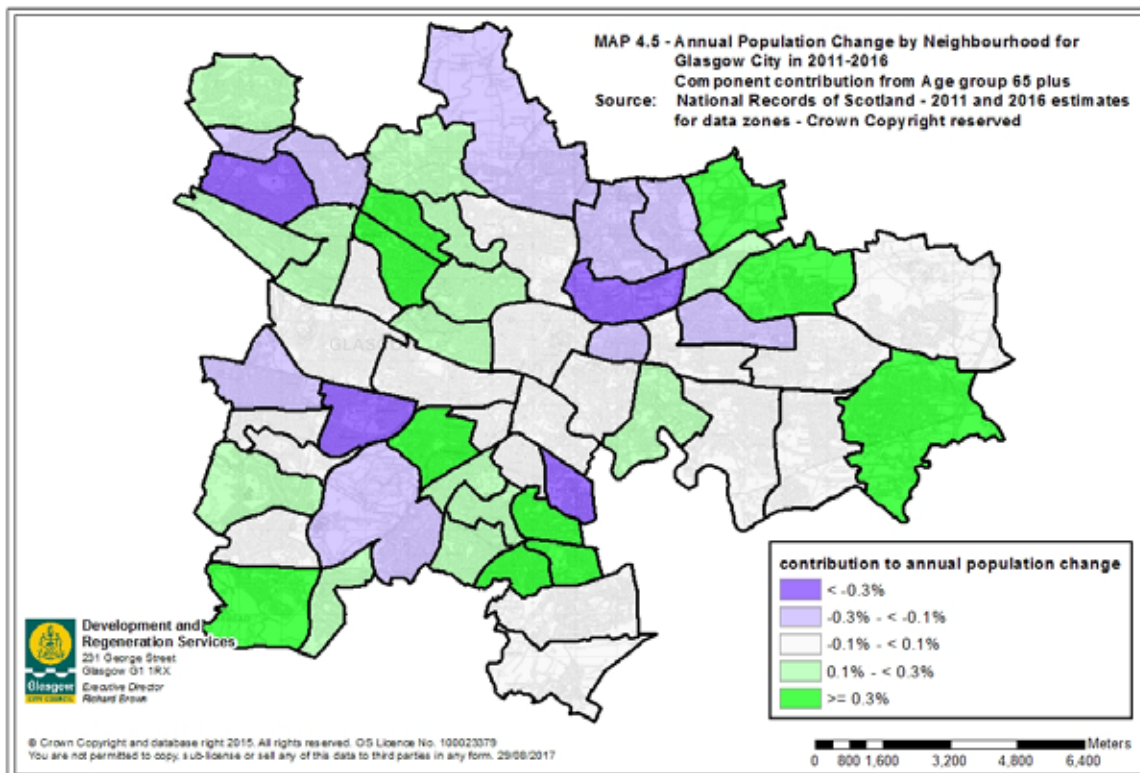
- 4.7 Maps 4.3 to 4.5 (see pages 8, 9 and 10) show the contribution to the annual population change by the age groups “0 to 15”, “16 to 64” and “65 plus” (see also Appendix, Tables A6 and A7).
- 4.8 The **number of children** (age 0 to 15) has risen considerably North of the river Clyde: from Maryhill Road Corridor to Hillhead/Woodlands, City Centre, Calton/Bridgeton, Parkhead/Dalmarnock and Haghill/Carntyne and from Balornock/Barmulloch to Blackhill/Hogganfield. South of the river Clyde there were considerable increases from Greater Govan to Ibrox/Kingston, Greater Gorbals and Govanhill and in South Nitshill/Darnley (see Map 4.3).
- 4.9 The number of children has reduced considerably for some neighbourhoods in North West (from Drumchapel to Blairdardie, Knightswood and Yoker/Scotstoun), in North (from Lambhill/Milton to Ruchill/Possilpark, Springburn and Sighthill/Royston), in East (Mount Vernon/East Shettleston and Baillieston), in South West (Crookston/South Cardonald, Corkehill, Pollok and Arden/Carnwadric) and in South East (Cathcart/Simshill, Croftfoot and Castlemilk).



- 4.10 Map 4.4 shows that the growth in Glasgow's working age population (approximated by the age group "16 to 64") has been concentrated in the neighbourhoods immediately north and south of the river Clyde: from Broomhill/Partick West to Parkhead/Dalmarnock and from Greater Govan to Greater Gorbals.
- 4.11 Since the **age group "16 to 64"** is the most sizable part of the overall population, it is not surprising that Map 4.4 shows important similarities with Map 4.2 (see page 7). However, there are also differences.
- 4.12 The contribution from the "age 16 to 64" population to the annual population change can be **higher** than the latter when there are **reductions** in the numbers of children and/or elderly. Examples are: Blairdardie, Knightswood, Lambhill/Milton, Springburn and Corkerhill/North Pollok, with reductions in the number of children and Blairdardie, Knightswood, Temple/Anniesland, Lambhill/Milton, Springburn, North Cardonald/Penilee and Bellahouston/Mosspark with reductions in the number of elderly.
- 4.13 The contribution from the "age 16 to 64" population to the annual population change can be **lower** than the latter when there are **increases** in the numbers of children and/or elderly. Examples are: Blackhill/Hogganfield, Ruchazie/Garthamlock, Tollcross/West Shettleston and Govanhill with increases in the number of children and Kelvindale, Anniesland/Jordanhill, Blackhill/Hogganfield, Ruchazie/Garthamlock and King's Park with increases in the number of elderly.



- 4.14 Map 4.5 shows that **the number of elderly (age 65 and over)** has grown considerably in the North West (from Maryhill/Summerston and Maryhill Corridor to Kelvindale/Kelvinside, Hyndland/Dowanhill/Partick East, Hillhead/Woodlands and Yorkhill/Anderston, in Drumchapel, Anniesland/Jordanhill/Whiteinch and Yoker/Scotstoun), in the North East (from Robroyston to Blackhill/Hogganfield and Ruchazie/Garthamlock, in Parkhead/Dalmarnock and Baillieston), in the South East (from Pollokshields West to Shawlands/Strathbungo, Langside/Battlefield, Newlands, Cathcart, King's Park and Croftfoot) and in the South West (South Nitshill/Darnley, Arden/Carnwadric and Pollok).
- 4.15 The number of elderly has reduced in the North West (Knightswood, Blairdardie and Temple/Anniesland), in the North (Lambhill/Milton, Springburn, Balornock/Barmulloch and Sighthill/Royston), in the East (Dennistoun and Riddrie/Cranhill) and in the South (North Cardonald/Penilee, Bellahouston/Craigton/Mosspark, Pollokshaws/Mansewood and Toryglen).

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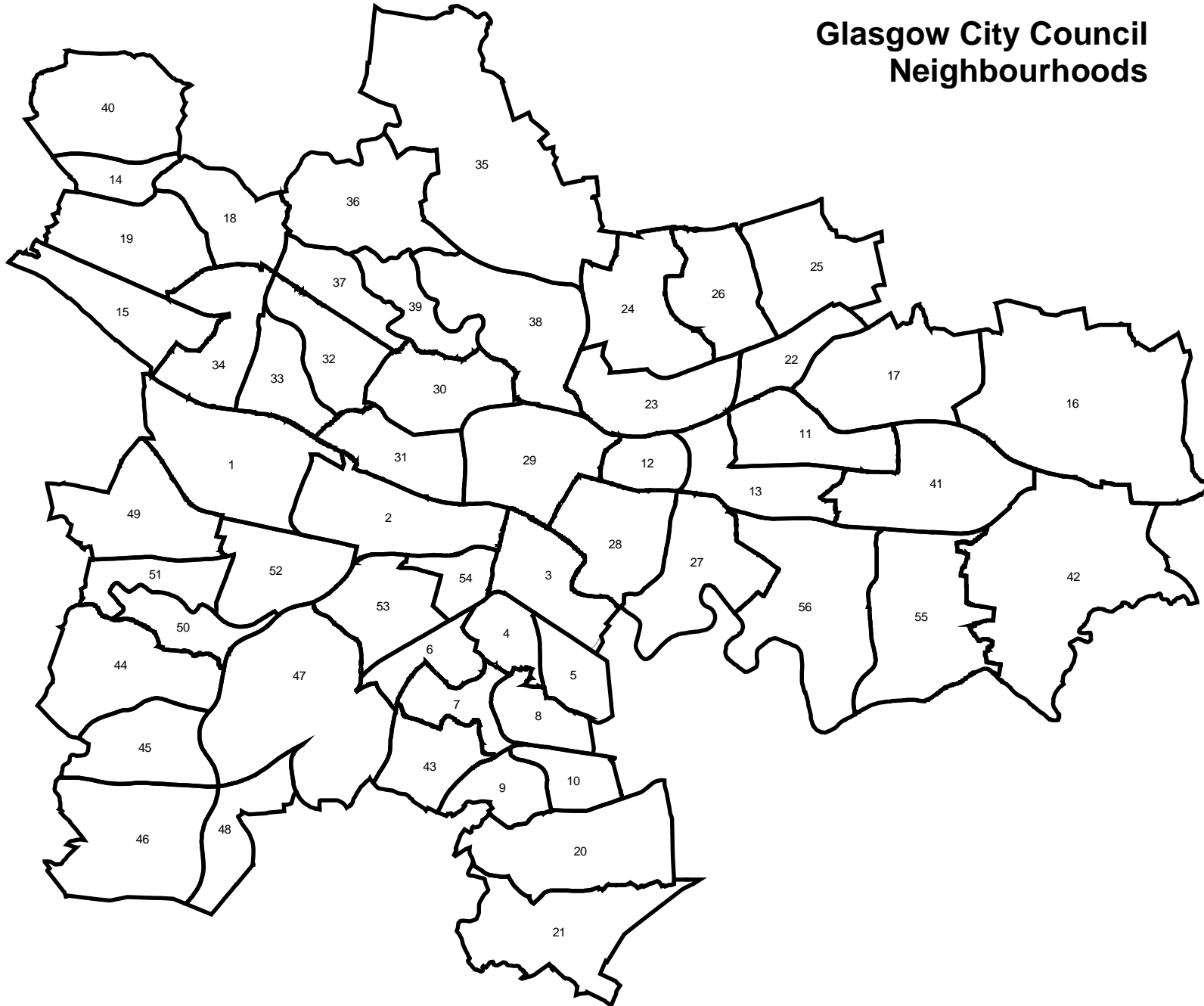
