Why did we consult?

Under Part 8 of the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015, Local Authorities are required to carry out consultation exercise when seeking to change the use, or sell, any properties forming part of the Common Good. Glasgow City Council are in the process of changing use of and letting land at Elder Park Depot; Elder Park is one of the Council's Common Good properties. The creation of Outdoor Space for Learning will constitute a change of use and disposal of Common Good Land and, as such, representations were sought on the proposal.

What is progressing?

Following the consultation period, Glasgow City Council is progressing with negotiating the letting of land at Elder Park to Glasgow City Mission in order to create an Outdoor Space for Learning through the People Make Glasgow Communities programme.
