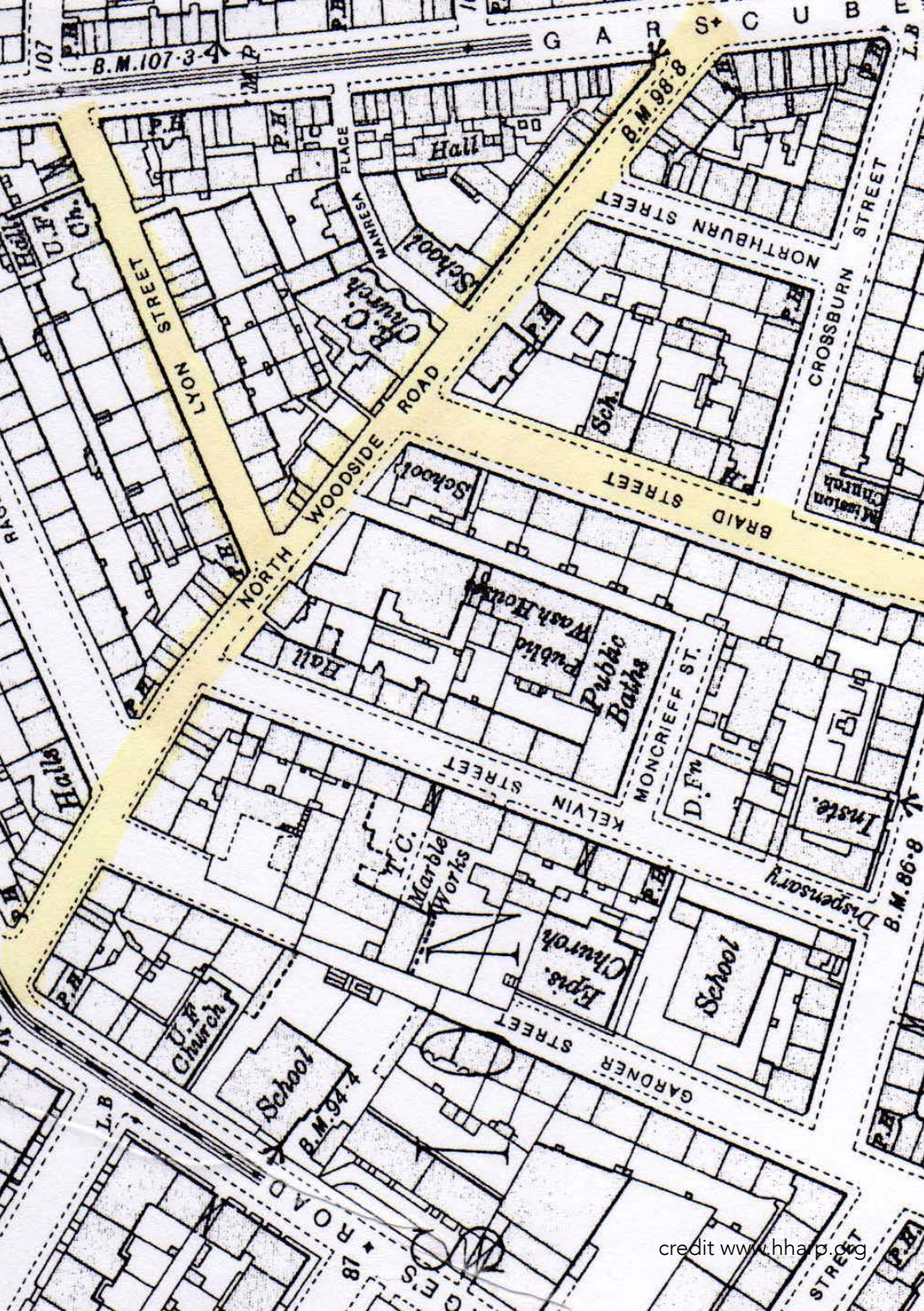

this regiment both dying in the Battle
of the Somme a month apart. We have
gone with the Peter Kelly from Glasgow
and not the Peter Kelly from Blantyre
(Service Number 12509). However we
are not 100% sure which lived at 8 Lyon
Street Glasgow at this time.
